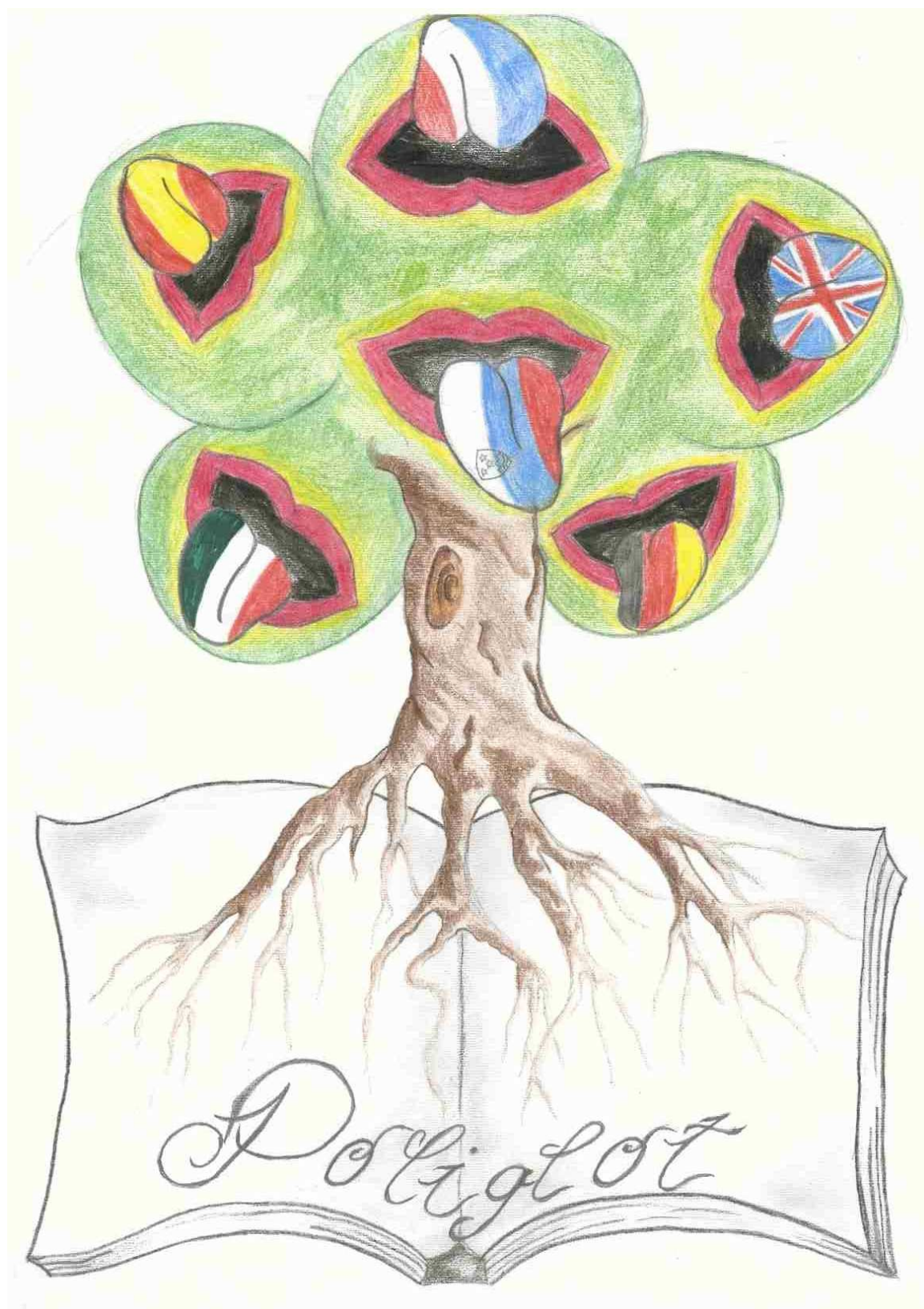

## Sea levels may rise three times more than first thought

Latest prediction on the effect of climate change suggests that large **tracts** (1) of Britain's coastline would end up under water.

Sea levels may rise three times faster than the official predictions of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and the global average sea level may increase by as much as 1.9 metres (6ft 3in) by 2100, scientists said yesterday.

The new **estimation** (2) comes just one week after another international scientific body concluded that the IPCC had been too conservative in estimating a maximum of 59 centimetres of sea level rise this century as a **consequence** (3) of global warming.

Scientists believe earlier estimates failed to take into **consideration** (4) gaps in the knowledge of how melting ice sheets will **influence** (5) sea level, as well as technical errors in the calculations which have now been corrected, giving a much higher figure for estimated sea level rise than those published by the IPCC.

A sea level rise of 1.9m would result in large tracts of eastern England being inundated with seawater, and would wipe out many low-lying island nations as well as making large parts of Bangladesh **unlivable** (6). It would also increase the chances of storm surges flooding major coastal cities, such as New York and London, even with the protection offered by the Thames Barrier.

The latest **research** (7), published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, found that global average sea levels are **probable** (8) to rise by between 75cm and 190cm by the end of the century **because of** (9) the thermal rise of the warmer oceans and the melting of mountain glaciers and polar ice sheets.

Stefan Rahmstorf of the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research in Germany, and Martin Vermeer of Helsinki University of Technology in Finland, said sea levels are rising faster as a result of temperature increases, especially at the poles, which are warming at a faster rate than many other parts of the world.

"Since 1990, sea level has been rising at 3.4 millimetres per year, twice as fast as on average over the 20th century. Even if that rate just remained steady, this would already lead to 34 centimetres **increase** (10) in the 21st century," Dr Rahmstorf said.



"But the data show us clearly – the warmer it gets, the faster the sea level rises. If we want to prevent a galloping sea level rise, we should stop global warming as soon as possible," he said.

The 1.9m increase will occur if greenhouse gas emissions continue to increase on their present trajectory which happens to be the worst-case scenario of the IPCC. **Decreasing (11)** emissions early this century will have a **comparable (12)** effect on reducing the maximum sea level rises, the scientists said.

"More **important (13)** even than the very high figures for sea-level rise is the almost clockwork precision by which, on climatic time scales, temperature drives sea level rise," said Dr Vermeer.

Last week the Scientific Committee on Antarctic Research **approved of (14)** Dr Rahmstorf's 2007 assessment of future sea level rise, when it agreed that the IPCC will have to increase its future predictions. Dr Rahmstorf said that if the committee agreed with his earlier assessment, it is also likely to go along with his latest study, predicting a 1.9m rise. One of the greatest difficulties in assessing future sea levels is the problem of gauging how fast it might take for polar ice sheets to **dissolve (15)** – whether they melt slowly, or slip quickly into the sea.

#### *Last Chance to See ...*

Assumptions are the things you don't know you're making, which is why it is so disorienting the first time you take the plug out of a wash basin in Australia and see the water spiralling down the hole the other way round. The very laws of physics are telling you how far you are from home.

In New Zealand even the telephone dials are numbered anticlockwise. This has nothing to do with the laws of physics - they just do it differently there. The shock is that it had never occurred to you that there was any other way of doing it. In fact you had never even thought about it at all, and suddenly here it is - different. The ground slips.

Dialling in New Zealand takes quite a bit of concentration because every digit is where you least expect to find it. Try and do it quickly and you will inevitably misdial because your automatic habit jumps in and takes over before you have a chance to stop it. The habit of telephone dials is so deep that it has become an assumption, and you don't even know you're making it.

China is in the northern hemisphere, so its wash basins drain clockwise, like ours. Their telephone dials are numbered like ours. Both those things are familiar. But every single other thing is different, and the assumptions that you don't know you're making will only get you into trouble and confusion.

I had a kind of inkling that this would be the case from what little I knew of other people's experiences in China. I sat in the plane on the long flight to Beijing trying to unravel my habits, to unthink as it were, and feeling slightly twitchy about it.

I started buying copious quantities of aftershave. Each time the duty-free trolley came round I bought a bottle. I had never done anything like it before in my life. My normal, instinctive reaction had always been just to shake my head and carry on reading my magazine. This time I thought it would be more Zen-like to say, 'Yes, all right. What have you got?' I was not the only person caught by surprise.

'Have you gone completely mad?' Mark asked me as I slipped a sixth different bottle into my hand baggage.

'I'm trying to challenge and subvert my own fundamental assumptions as to what constitutes rationally constructed behaviour.'

'Does that mean yes?'

'I mean that I'm just trying to loosen up a bit,' I said. 'An aeroplane doesn't give you much scope for arbitrary and alternative types of behaviour, so I'm just making the most of the opportunities that are offered.'

'I see.'

Mark shifted uncomfortably in his seat and frowned deeply into his book.

'What are you going to do with all that stuff?' he asked a while later over an airline meal.

'Dunno,' I said. 'It's a problem, isn't it?'

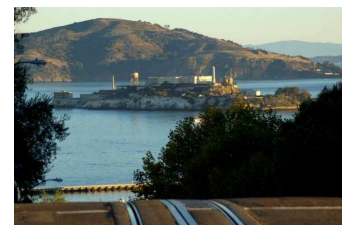

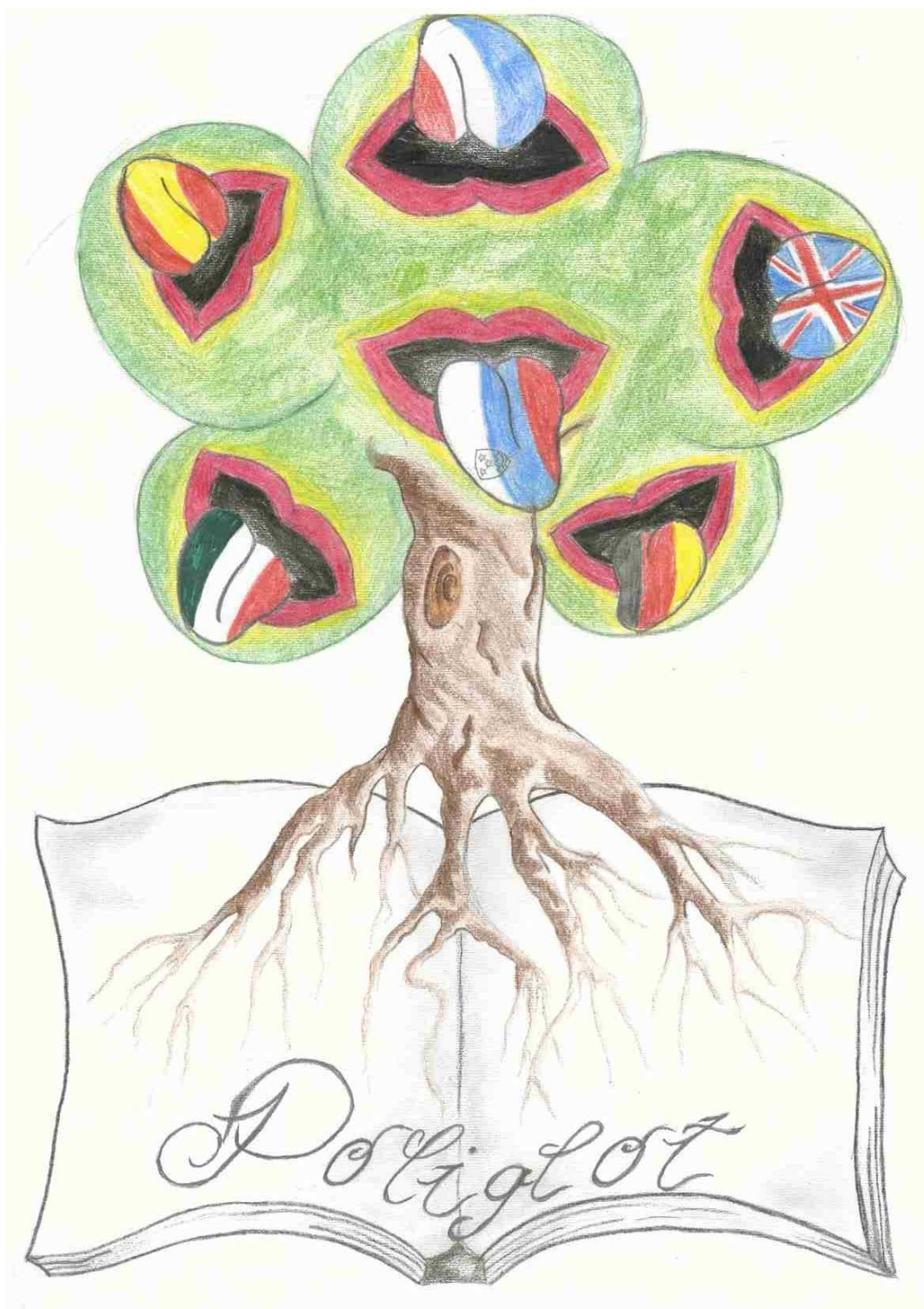
